





1. In 1337 Edward III of England and Philip VI of France started the war, mainly over English land in France	3. In the late 1300s, the French under General du Guesclin did much better, winning land from first Edward III and then Richard II of England.	5. In 1415 Henry V invaded France, to fight the French king Charles VI. Henry captured Harfleur then won a great victory at Agincourt.	7. In 1422 Henry V died before Charles VI, so the war started again. Joan of Arc helped the French to do well, but was burned as a witch by the English in 1431.
			
2. In 1360, after the English victories at Crécy and Poitiers, the French made peace with the Treaty of Bretigny, giving up Calais and Aquitaine.	4. During peacetime, some soldiers become bandits, causing chaos.	6. In 1420 the French made peace in the Treaty of Troyes: Henry married the French princess; was made Regent of France and heir to the French crown	8. By 1453 the English only had Calais left after losing battles because the French had better armies with more guns and the Duke of Burgundy changed sides, leaving the English. The Treaty of Chatillon ended the war.
