SUGGESTED REVISION TOPICS (Select two)

- a) For a King or Queen you have studied describe the problems that he/she faced on becoming king/queen (20 marks)
 - b) Explain how he dealt with one of those problems (10 marks)
- a) For a King or Queen you have studied describe the problems that he/she faced with the Church (20 marks)
 - b) Explain who you believe was right or wrong in this argument. (10 marks)
- a) Describe the events that led to Magna Carta (20 marks)
 - b) Explain the significance of Magna Carta (10 marks)
- a) Describe the events leading up to the beginning of a civil war such as the Baron's War. (20 marks)
 - b) Explain the results of this civil war. (10 marks)
- a) Describe a major disease which affected England in this period (20 marks)
 - b) What were the effects of the disease on England (10 marks)
- a) Describe a battle in which an English king lost his throne. (20 marks)
 - b) Explain why he lost the battle. (10 marks)
- a) Describe a battle in which an English king fought against a foreign country. (20marks)
 - b) Explain why the winning side was victorious. (10 marks)

There will be three sources (two written, one picture) and four questions.

Question 1 & 2 will test your **understanding** of the sources.

Question 3 will ask you to **compare/contrast** Source C with the Sources A & B

Question 4 will ask you about which source you believe to be the **most useful** and why.
