Teachers, I once read, experience more social interactions than any other profession. Children, colleagues, parents, Governors, and even their own families (if they can fit them in either end of a standard hectic day). In the case of my own most of it by Blackberry bbm it seems and probably the most instant and effective (even if it feels a dismally soulless way to exchange news, at least to this old school Headmaster!). From this it probably follows that Heads like this one could best describe their lives as one of continuous communications, and I hope you won't be offended by this but the best ones of all are those which I have with your children! This week is no exception – the Year 2 boy who told me about the lullaby he sang to Nursery; the little girl in Nursery who told me five times in two minutes that she knows who I am (which was reassuring); the Year 3 girl who came into my study to show me her specially made version of the school prospectus, awash with photos snipped and sellotaped in, and excellent it was, too; the earnest little Year 4 boy who told me he had heard someone walking on the roof above his classroom and could it, he wondered (and hoped) be Father Christmas arriving early (I didn't tell him that it was a contractor fitting solar panels on the Junior Department roof!); the gang of Year 5 children who told me with some modesty how brilliantly they had played in their matches the day before (and they had); the Year 6 girl who wanted to tell me about something which has been troubling her; the Year 7 boy who spoke so maturely at lunch about his new found passion for Art and his inspiring new teacher; or my outstanding Heads of School in Year 8 who never fail to lift my spirits and fill me with optimism every morning.

Such daily witterings are merely the tip of the iceberg, of course, because there have been thousands of similar conversations this week with your children, and they tell me so much about their ambition and their love of school life and the trust they place in us as teachers. Photos capture some of that, bbm messages hint at greater and more substantial things, but in the end we need to listen to our children, find the time to converse and engage, build those trusted relationships which follow, and relate to them in ways which respect their dignity, their need to be heard, and their enthusiasm for life. I can cast a look back over an action packed week with a glow of admiration, and peer forwards at the wonderful things which await and which will fill every minute until our carol services at St Andrews and the final assembly on the last morning of term. It is shaping into a terrific term, and the quality of the conversations have made it especially so. If we can stay clear of snow before the end of term, even better!

Have a good weekend, and good luck to all the young people and their teachers who will be playing rugby, hockey and netball at Perrot Hill in Somerset on Saturday. What an adventure, and what to listen to afterwards!

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Information for Parents

Our Breakfast Club and After School Club (formerly Day Boarding) have been developed to provide parents (whose children are in Year 3 and above) with greater flexibility. You can make use of the Club on a regular or occasional basis; whenever your children need to arrive earlier or leave later than the core school day. The Breakfast Club and After School Club allow day pupils to join members of the Boarding House for morning or evening meals as well as supervised activity and study sessions.

Breakfast

7.30-8.00am Mon-Fri

This is a cooked breakfast consisting of eggs, bacon, sausages, toast etc. A variety of cereals and fruit are also available along with juices, tea and hot chocolate.

This is a very social occasion shared with boarding pupils and the Boarding House staff. Children then brush their teeth in the House and leave for school at 8.10am.

Evening Meal

5.30-6.00pm Mon, Tues & Thurs, 6-6.30pm Wed

This is a very sociable mealtime, with a relaxed atmosphere and time for conversation amongst the children. It is the main meeting time when notices and discussions take place with House staff, and allows Club members to feel very much part of the boarding community.

There is always a hot cooked option with a variety of accompanying vegetables, followed by a dessert. A vegetarian option is always available along with a selection of fruit, and juice to drink.

Please note that on Wednesday the Evening Meal is served at 6pm until 6.30pm after the study period from 5-6pm).

Study Period

6-7pm Mon, Tues & Thurs, 5-6pm Wed

The school day finishes at 5pm but many children stay for the prep session until 5.30pm. Boarders also complete an hour 'study period' from 6-7pm, which Club members may also join. This is a time to complete all preps and homework, and children may have use of the computer facilities if necessary.

The sessions are staffed by the House Tutors, all of whom are teaching staff and who are on hand to guide pupils through any specific difficulties with their work.

Full After School Club

until 8pm, Mon-Thurs

Following the evening meal and study period, Full After School Club members take part in one of the evening Boarding House activities. These are varied each night and include a range of games in the sports hall, use of the pool, activities in specialist areas like music or ICT rooms, the woods and field. Whole House games and challenges are also played such as quizzes or treasure hunts.

Flexi-Boarding

The Flex-Boarding option allows children to board for a set night or nights each week throughout the term. Flexi-boarders follow the same routines as full weekly boarders. They have set beds and space to store possessions to save having to bring too much home each week.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

These Clubs have been developed to provide parents (whose children are in Year 3 and above) with greater flexibility. You can make use of the Club on a regular or occasional basis; whenever your children need to arrive earlier or leave later than the core school day. Club members join the Boarding House for morning or evening meals as well as study periods and supervised activities. These are varied each night and range from different games in the sports hall, sessions in the pool, activities in specialist areas like music or ICT, as well as use of the woods and field. Whole House games and challenges are also played such as quizzes or treasure hunts.

Breakfast (7.30-8.00am) Mon-Fri

This is a cooked breakfast consisting of eggs, bacon, sausages, toast etc. A variety of cereals are also available along with juices, tea and hot chocolate. Water and fruit are always available. This is a very social occasion shared with the Boarding House staff. Children then brush their teeth in the House and leave for school at 8.10am.

Evening Meal

This is served at 5.30pm and is the main meeting time when notices and discussions take place with House staff. All meals are started and ended by giving thanks with a short prayer. There is always a hot cooked option and this is accompanied by a dessert. A variety of vegetables are provided to accompany the meal. A vegetarian option is always available along with a selection of fruit.

Please note that on Wednesday the Evening Meal is served at 6pm until 6.30pm after the study period (5-6pm).

Study Period

The school day finishes at 5pm but many children stay for the prep session until 5.30pm. Boarders also complete an hour 'study period' from 6-7pm. This is a time to complete all preps and homework. Children may have use of the computer facilities if necessary. The sessions are staffed by the House Tutors, all of whom are teaching staff who can guide pupils through any specific difficulties.

For flexi and full weekly boarders (Years 7 and 8) a later revision session is arranged from 8.20-9pm. This session focuses on exam preparation and is also guided by two House Tutors.

Single Night Boarding

There may be occasions when a pupil wants to try one night of boarding or parents are away and would like to leave their son or daughter to stay at school with friends. This option begins at 5.30pm all the way through to include breakfast the following day.

Children can also be booked in for longer periods of time (space permitting).

Cricket Academy

The Cricket Academy builds on a long tradition of cricket within Feltonfleet to create a structure to improve the standard of Feltonfleet's cricket and to provide opportunities for pupils from outside the school community to benefit from the cricketing expertise and facilities available at the school.

The Coaching Academy is run jointly by Nigel Baxter, the school's First XI Cricket Coach, and Chris Smith. Nigel has coached not only for many years within schools but also at Club level and is an ECB Level 2 coach. Chris has coached at School, Club, and County level as well as being on the England Schools' strategic development group. He too is an ECB Level 2 coach.

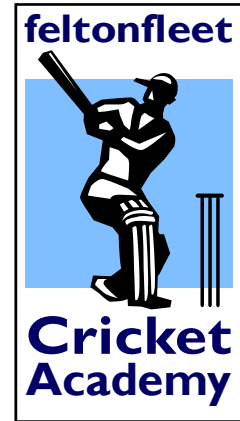
